## **School Profile**

Padbury Primary School is located approximately 25 kilometres north of the Perth CBD in the City of Joondalup. It is situated in a green beltway adjacent to local MacDonald Reserve. Our appeal is that of a small family oriented school with a strong sense of community, the values we celebrate and the commitment to realising the potential of each and every student in our care.

The school is surrounded by well-kept, undulating grounds including reticulated school oval, shaded play areas with mature native tuart trees and a range of play areas to support a wide variety of learning and play activities.

We share our location with the West Coast Language Development centre. We have an onsite Dental Therapy Centre. Families can also access the services of a school nurse, a School Psychologist and our School Chaplain. After hours and Vacation care is also available on the school site.

### **Our Vision**

Padbury PS aims to develop a school community which encourages academic, personal, social and environmental responsibilities. The school is committed to providing a safe and supportive environment that challenges students to achieve personal excellence in all endeavours and to be active citizens of the local and global community.

- To educate and equip children to take their place in society as confident and responsible citizens;
- To guide, support and encourage each child to achieve at their optimum level at all times:
- To encourage children to develop pride in their achievements and the achievements of others; and

## **STRATEGIC PLAN 2021 - 2024**

During 2020, the school undertook a review of its current strategic plan (2018-2020). This review highlighted the successes which were achieved, measured against the student achievement improvement targets. This review, when considered in conjunction with the Public School Review conducted in late Term 4, 2019 was very positive and confirms the directions being taken by the school.

During the latter part of 2020, staff commenced the development of a new strategic plan (2021 - 2024) and by the end of the year a draft plan had been developed to align with the strategic directions of the Department of Education's Strategic Directions documents.

The new plan will focus on 6 key improvement drivers:

- 1. Provide every student with a pathway to a successful future
- 2. Strengthen support for teaching and learning in every classroom
- 3. Build the capacity of our principals, our teachers and our allied professionals
- 4. Support increased autonomy within a unified public school system
- 5. Partner with families, communities and agencies to support the engagement of every student
- 6. Use evidence to drive decision making at all levels of the system.

The new strategic plan will describe what Padbury PS will do in relation to these drivers and how the school intends to go about it. The plan will incorporate strategies which the school identified as part of the Public School Review process and a range of academic, non-academic and compliance and other targets to measure the school's success over the coming years.

## **School Priorities for 2020**

## Maintaining literacy and numeracy performance

Staff planning, teaching, assessing and reporting practices reflect the requirements of the Australian Curriculum. Staff continued to embed common understandings and approaches to writing and reading comprehension. A strong spelling focus was evident during 2020 with staff working collaboratively to implement a whole school progression for the teaching of spelling.

## Developing Digital Technologies

After undertaking professional learning in 2018, staff implemented digital technologies strategies within the learning program. This included the development of an ICT skills checklist which outlines the sequence for developing a range of ICT skills from Kindergarten to Year 6. Coding activities, integrated into a range of learning areas, were also implemented in all classrooms.

## Developing STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths)

Building the capacity of teachers to deliver STEM activities commenced in 2020. As a critical first step, a lead teacher was identified and a specialist STEM program introduced for students in Years 1-6. During the year the lead teacher and Principal attended a series of STEM workshops to support the integration of STEM into all classes. This will be an on-going priority in 2021.

### Student Performance – Academic

Due to the impact of COVID-19, formal NAPLAN assessments were cancelled in 2020.

## 2020 Programs

Throughout 2020, Padbury Primary School offered a number of successful in-school and extra-curricular programs and activities for identified students. These include, but are not limited to the following:

#### **Early Year Extension (EYE)**

This program is provided by the NMER PEAC and is offered to identified students in Years 1-3.

#### **Instrumental Music**

This program is provided by the School of Instrumental Music (SIM) and is offered to identified students. Prior to 2020 the SIM program was only available to identified Year 6 students. In 2020, the program was extended to include identified Year 5 students.

#### The Arts

In 2020 the music program was again conducted by Mrs Alban. Children were exposed to a range of musical activities incorporating both theory and practical work.

Mrs Reid continued the outstanding visual arts program in 2020 and the children were again provided with a wide range of opportunities to explore art and craft through a variety of media. Regular displays of students' work were featured around the school and these provide colourful evidence of the quality of the program offered.

#### Japanese (Languages Other than English)

Japanese was taught from year 1 to year 6. The focal points of the classes were the four micro-skills; Listening, Speaking, Reading and Writing, as well as intercultural awareness. The hiragana alphabet, katakana alphabet and Kanji characters were introduced in all year levels.

#### Highlights

- Early introduction of hiragana and katakana alphabets in year 3
- Early introduction of kanji characters in year 5

#### **Physical Education**

2020 was again a busy year in the area of physical education. The program was run by Mrs Holmes and students were involved in physical education lessons each week as well as organised senior sport sessions. Due to COVID19 restrictions the annual interschool lightning carnival was cancelled. In lieu of this Mrs Holmes organised a lightning carnival at school for Padbury PS students later in the year. This was very well received by the students who thoroughly enjoyed the day, whilst providing an opportunity for students to display their leadership and teamwork skills.

Whilst the school conducted its own cross country event, the interschool event was cancelled, again due to COVID19 restrictions. These restrictions resulted in schools in the Duncraig Partnership Network conducting their athletics carnivals without parents. The interschool carnival was also a parent free event. This decision was made in consultation with all competing schools.

A number of well attended clinics were organised from a variety of sporting associations and this enhanced the PE program and provided students with the opportunity to try different sports.

## **In-term Swimming**

Lessons for all students from Pre-Primary to Year 6 were conducted in Term 1 at Craigie Leisure Centre. Unfortunately, due to COVID19, the second week of lessons had to be cancelled.

## **Edu-Dance**

Edu-Dance was again a highlight of the Padbury school year. All students attended dance lessons during term 3 with a qualified instructor. Students learnt the moves to well-honed Hip Hop and Modern dance moves.

### **ANZAC** Assembly

The annual ANZAC Commemorative Service was cancelled in 2020 due to the evolving situation regarding COVID19.

#### **Attendance**

2020 attendance rates are not available for publication as they were adversely affected by the COVID-19 pandemic and are not comparable to previous years.

The school continues to highlight the need for regular attendance with families via the school newsletter and personal letters to parents when their child's attendance falls below 90%. This will continue to be promoted through a range of strategies in 2021.


- Curriculum support;

- Subsidising the Year 5/6 camp.




