#### Parents of Year 1 Students

To ensure continuity of learning and social and emotional development, Year 1 teachers will engage in shared planning, programs and activities.

Students in Year 1 will play in the main school playground.

Composite classes commonly occur in schools, constructed with careful consideration by teachers and administration staff based on their professional judgement. Staff draw upon their knowledge of students academic, social and emotional development, friendships, additional needs and previous placements to make these informed decisions.

It is important to note students are not grouped only according to their academic performance in the class above or below their year level. The sizes of the classes vary according to the industrial agreement for public schools of which we receive funding for. At Padbury Primary School we structure our classes to ensure student numbers fall within the recommended size where possible, taking into consideration our enrolment numbers.

Importantly, collaboration with staff about the learning programs and important events is essential to ensure the continuity of learning and social development of students in the same cohort.



### Semester 2 Reports 2023

The Semester 2 reports were emailed on Tuesday. When assessing your child's report, we suggest you download it as a pdf and save it to your device. The link will remain for 4 weeks only. Please check your junk folder if you did not receive your email link. You can contact the school office if you still did not receive it.

#### Pre primary to Year 6

In Pre-primary to Year 6 academic achievement is reported using the A-E grades (Year 3-6) or grade descriptors (Pre primary to Year 2). These are:

- Excellent
- High
- Satisfactory
- Limited Very Low

Your child's grade is determined by the Western Australian Curriculum standards. These standards describe the expected knowledge and skills for students who have been taught the content for the full year of schooling. Teachers are required to make a professional judgment drawing upon assessment data, work samples and observations.

At times parents query a report where a different grade has been previously attained. It is important to recognise that often children progress at different rates throughout their schooling, which can be reflected in their grades. If a change in grade is significant, your child's teacher may contact you before the report is issued to request an interview.

### **Kindergarten**

The Kindergarten student progress report is based on the West Australian Kindergarten Guidelines and the Early Years Learning Framework. The assessment criteria is different to the Pre primary to Year 6 report. Details about the criteria including learning descriptors will be included in your child's kindergarten report.

### **Presentation Assembly**

It was wonderful seeing the school community come together to celebrate the success of our students. I also enjoyed seeing all the happy faces of the award recipients. Thank you to Anjali and Millie for their superb job at hosting the event.

#### **Graduation Assembly**

This week we farewelled our amazing group of Year 6 students at the graduation ceremony. The 2023 graduating class leave our school to embark on the next chapter of their schooling journey. We wish them all the best in secondary school and know they will make the most of the opportunities ahead of them.

#### Work over the holidays

Pleasingly, the old undercover area will be re surfaced over the summer holiday. The surface will improve the aesthetics of the school whilst including some painted on games for the students to play. I look forward to giving the students opportunities to engage in games such as handball, hopscotch etc, which will be fun. Additionally, the benched seating will be ungraded and replaced.

Furthermore, our mural to commemorate the  $50^{th}$  Anniversary will be completed by day one next year. This is being painted in the new undercover area by the artist Paul Deej. The mural will include aspects of the local flora and fauna.

#### In conclusion

I'd like to acknowledge the hard working commitment of the staff at Padbury Primary School for their investment in your children's learning and development. I know the students are central to our decision making and practice at Padbury Primary School.

# Hon Dr Tony Buti MLA Minister for Education; Aboriginal Affairs; Citizenship and Multicultural Interests

Dear Parent

#### STRENGTHENING SUPPORT FOR SCHOOLS TO ADDRESS VAPING

It is hard to believe another school year is coming to an end.

Can I say a big thank you to all parents and carers for supporting their school communities - without your commitment the education system simply would not work. I am writing to ask for your support on a crucial issue. You may have recently seen my announcement about the new measures we are implementing to address vaping in schools. The prevalence of vapes in our community is a serious issue.

The biggest misunderstanding is they are harmless compared to cigarettes - this is not true - vapes are not safe and they are contributing to a new generation of nicotine dependency. It is a growing concern for school communities, with incidents of students being found in possession of vapes or caught vaping at school becoming a serious disruption to the education of our kids. To strengthen our response and to continue to support principals and teachers to effectively address vaping in our schools, we have now implemented further measures.

In collaboration with the Department of Health and the Minister for Health, new teaching and learning resources now apply for students in Years 5 to 7, which will complement those launched in the original Vaping Toolkit. We are also taking strong action in expanding the Student Behaviour in Public Schools policy. Principals have now been given additional powers to address vaping, whereby a student can lose good standing under this policy for use or possession of vapes at school.

This means, students caught vaping risk not being able to attend school events like balls, graduations, and other extra-curricular activities. We consulted with the Department of Health and several organisations, including the WA Student Council, in the development of these initiatives to make sure our approach is appropriate and meets the needs of students, and we believe a whole school approach is the most impactful way to address this issue.

We are confident these new measures, alongside other initiatives across Government, will help to reduce the impact these dangerous products are having on our community particularly our children and young people.

Thank you again for your support of these measures to ensure the future health and wellbeing of our young people. I hope you all enjoy the summer holidays and have a safe festive season.





# A Little About Us

We are a registered Charitable Not-for-Profit, committed to our mission of providing children the best care possible. We have recently celebrated our 15th year of providing care for School Aged children in the Northern Suburbs.

Our Team of 25 dedicated and fun-loving Educators are led by the Service Director, Adam; two Program Coordinators, Tash and Meg and four Supervisors, Cathy, John, Dayna and Jordy. Together we have accumulated several lifetimes of experience and each bring unique skills and interests to create a truly wonderful program for our kids.

# Our Services

Wonderland provides vibrant onsite care services from the outstanding facilities of Padbury Primary School's Undercover Area and Art Room. Our Operating times are:

Before School Care: 7am to start of class
After School Care: End of class to 6pm
School Holiday and Pupil Free: 7am to 6pm

We cater for all ages from our 3 year-olds ready to start their exciting first year of school through to our 13 year-olds transitioning to their High School journey.

Wonderland also offers a full day program from our Duncraig Service for our Kindy kids on the days they do not have school with a shuttle bus between Padbury and Duncraig.



# Our Fees

We believe all Child Care Services should practice complete openness and transparency with their fees. Wonderland's Fees for the commencement of 2024 are below. Fees are reviewed in line with changes to wages, insurance and other costs and any changes are communicated well in advance.

Before School Care: \$24 After School Care: \$36

School Holiday Care: \$80 + Excursion

Kindy Full Days: \$95

The full Child Care Subsidy of up to 90% applies to all of Wonderland's fees. Contact Centrelink to find out more about the Child Care Subsidy, or check your eligibility.

There are no hidden fees and charges imposed by Wonderland. We do not charge extra for Casual Bookings, Last Minute Bookings, Transport, Late Collection, Breakfast and the list goes on...
