Australian Early Development Census (AEDC)

Every three years, all schools across Australia conduct the AEDC census with their Pre-primary cohort. This census provides a national picture of the development, health and wellbeing of children in their first year of school. The first AEDC was conducted in 2009 and the data provided by this survey over the past 10 years has assisted governments, community services and schools to identify whether children are 'on track' in their early years to achieve positive outcomes. The census also helps to identify areas where children and families require additional support. It measures development progress across the following five domains. These are:

- Physical health and wellbeing
- Social competence
- Emotional maturity
- Language and cognitive skills
- Communication skills and general knowledge

Parents of students currently in Pre-primary should have received information about the AEDC.

Dear Principal

I am pleased to announce the upcoming launch of the 2024 Premier's Reading Challenge. The challenge will run from Monday, 6 May to Friday, 6 September 2024 and is open for all Western Australian students from Kindergarten to Year 10.

Establishing a life-long love of reading is so important in the development of students' literacy skills. This year you will see an expanded range of inclusive reading formats and increased support for schools to participate in the program.

The challenge program is designed to encourage students' reading enjoyment and in turn, their future outcomes. Regardless of where your students live or how they want to be involved, there is an opportunity for your school to participate, including:

- · in-person or online workshops with a Western Australian writer
- · dassroom activities in the approved reading formats
- · recognition programs for students who improve their personal reading frequency
- · engagement with the challenge mascot, a book-loving alien, Dewey Dex.

During last year's challenge, more than 360,000 books were read by students across our State, which was an incredible achievement. A key reason for this exceptional outcome was the involvement of more than 500 school staff or Challenge Champions. As their name suggests, these staff championed the challenge and encouraged students to register to participate, reach their reading gioals and engage in school activities.

Enclosed you will find a bookmark for every student at your school and some promotional items that can be provided to your Challenge Champions.

I encourage you to nominate one or more school staff members to assist with your school's participation in this year's Premier's Reading Challenge. They can register by visiting premiers reading challenge.wa.edu.au/champions.

We are a registered Charitable Not-for-Profit, committed to our mission of providing children the best care possible. We have recently celebrated our 15th year of providing care for School Aged children in the Northern Suburbs.

Our Team of 25 dedicated and fun-loving Educators are led by the Service Director, Adam; two Program Coordinators, Tash and Meg and four Supervisors, Cathy, John, Dayna and Jordy. Together we have accumulated several lifetimes of experience and each bring unique skills and interests to create a truly wonderful program for our kids.

Our Services

Wonderland provides vibrant onsite care services from the outstanding facilities of Padbury Primary School's Undercover Area and Art Room. Our Operating times are:

Before School Care: 7am to start of class
After School Care: End of class to 6pm
School Holiday and Pupil Free: 7am to 6pm

We cater for all ages from our 3 year-olds ready to start their exciting first year of school through to our 13 year-olds transitioning to their High School journey.

Wonderland also offers a full day program from our Duncraig Service for our Kindy kids on the days they do not have school with a shuttle bus between Padbury and Duncraig.



Our Fees

We believe all Child Care Services should practice complete openness and transparency with their fees. Wonderland's Fees for the commencement of 2024 are below. Fees are reviewed in line with changes to wages, insurance and other costs and any changes are communicated well in advance.

Before School Care: \$24 After School Care: \$36

School Holiday Care: \$80 + Excursion

Kindy Full Days: \$95

The full Child Care Subsidy of up to 90% applies to all of Wonderland's fees. Contact Centrelink to find out more about the Child Care Subsidy, or check your eligibility.

There are no hidden fees and charges imposed by Wonderland. We do not charge extra for Casual Bookings, Last Minute Bookings, Transport, Late Collection, Breakfast and the list goes on...
